**IN RE: AMENDING  
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RE  
PARENTING COORDINATION IN  
FAMILY LAW CASES**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Administrative Order No. 06-03, entered on February 9, 2006, this Court adopted provisions that provided for the proper administration of parenting coordination within the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, as set forth in said Administrative Order, parenting coordinators were not to be appointed in Chapter 39 (dependency) or Chapter 741 (domestic violence) proceedings; and

**WHEREAS**, in that this Circuit's Unified Family Court Division often handles matters that include dependency and domestic violence issues, it has been deemed beneficial to have a parenting coordination involved in the resolution of such issues;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida, it is hereby **ORDERED**:

1. Administrative Order No. 06-03, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“2. Parenting coordinators shall not be appointed in chapter 39 or chapter 741 proceedings, except, it shall be within the discretion of the presiding judge handling Unified Family Court matters that include dependency and domestic issues, to determine whether a parenting coordinator should be involved in the resolution of such issues.”

2. In those Unified Family Court matters wherein parenting coordinators were appointed prior to the effective date of this Order, if the parties mutually agree, the parenting coordinators shall be allowed to continue their efforts.

3. Except as modified herein, all provisions of Administrative Order No. 06-03 remain in full force and effect.
